Abstract Formatting Instructions

- Title**
- Capital letters without a full stop at the end
 - Bold text
- Text**
- Maximum 300 words for abstract body
 - Arial font - 9 point size
 - Single spacing
 - Written in the English language
 - Use *italics* for scientific names
- Paragraphs**
- fully justified
 - do not indent paragraphs
 - leave one blank line between paragraphs
 - use superscripts to identify authors to institutions
- Example:
- John Smith¹, William Black¹, Jane Smithers^{1,2}

² Infectious Diseases Unit, Royal Melbourne Hospital, Carlton VIC Australia
- Abbreviations**
- use standard abbreviations only. When using abbreviations for compounds, spell out the name in full at the first mention and follow with the abbreviation in parenthesis
 - do not use abbreviations in the title
- Content**
- The purpose of the abstract is to define the precise subject of the presentation to an audience.
 - Content must include the study's objectives, methodology (if relevant), summary of results and the conclusion.
 - It is unsatisfactory to state that results will be presented or discussed at the workshop.
 - An abstract should not be a formal publication.
 - Tables, figures, literature references and acknowledgements should not form any part of the abstract's content.
 - It is the responsibility of the presenting author to ensure accuracy of content, spelling and presentation as abstracts will be published as submitted, pending any reformatting as may be required by the conference organisers.

Abstract deadline: 31 January 2012

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- Abstracts must include authors' details and be prepared in accordance with the guidelines above.
- By submitting an abstract the author/s automatically allows the National Strongyloidiasis Working Group (NSWG) to publish their abstract in the abstract handbook and the post-workshop website.
- When submitting your abstract details online you must indicate your preferred presentation type:
POSTER / ORAL
